Rabbi's Message



Happy 80th Birthday, Dad! I did a web search and found Clevelandseniors.com. Here is a brief snippet of the entry by Debbie Hanson:

Fred Eisenberg was born in Boston, Massachusetts on January 26, 1931 to Dr. Moses Joel and Violet Eisenberg. Growing up he was surrounded by friends of his parents who were scientists as well as philosophers and he was fascinated listening to them. With an eye toward electronics, Rabbi Fred took science classes at MIT. However, he found he preferred to spend time with people rather than things.

When he told his mother he wanted to be a rabbi, she called a family council to make sure he understood what he was doing. His uncles were prestigious attorneys. One was the counsel and advisor for Dwight Eisenhower. They expected him to go to Harvard Law. Rabbi Fred was not dissuaded. He left MIT and enrolled at Clark University where he earned his bachelor's degree.

Rabbi Fred Eisenberg was ordained in 1957 from Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati. That same year he married his one true love, Helen (nee Finer). He joined the Air Force that year "because I owed that to my country." He was shipped off to Texas and scheduled to go to Tokyo. The Air Force was not able to send Helen with him, and he would not leave his pregnant wife behind. There was an opening in Biloxi, Mississippi at Keesler Air Force Base. Keesler was a training base with over 30,000 people. Fred became the chaplain at the Base.

"I got there and realized I was in the Deep South - the real Deep South. At that time, if you were driving in a car with a black man, you had to sit in back or he had to sit in back. I disregarded that. That was the time when they were integrating the beaches in Biloxi. I was involved with the integration of the beaches. I went and marched."

Fred took his efforts a step further when he held an integrated Seder dinner. "There were some black Jews from Chicago and I invited my commander who was also black and it was a very interesting event. Didn't bother me - certainly bothered some other people. Here I was in Biloxi Mississippi causing them a lot of aggravation. Of course those were the days when they hung people. It was scary!"

After his Air Force time was up, he moved to Chicago where he was an associate rabbi for four years. The next seven years were spent in Grand Rapids, Michigan serving a congregation there. He took a position at Fairmount Temple Cleveland in 1972 and then founded Temple Israel in 1985.

Mom and you have logged many miles and touched many lives. We look forward to celebrating an early birthday with you on Friday, January 14. The oneg will be sponsored by your children and grandchildren. Not only that, two of your favorites will precede the oneg: Shabbat Shirah and the Second Grade Naming.

Happy 80th birthday upcoming to you, and mazel tov to our congregation. Everyone is invited to celebrate this simcha with us!

Editor's Note: This is Part 3 of a three-part series written by congregant Allen Gold about his recent trip with Volunteers for Israel.

How I Spent My Summer with Sar-el – Part 3

In Haifa, I was also staying in the German Colony, which I explored the first evening. This area, right below the Bahai Temple, has been renovated and holds many of the nice restaurants in the area. The next day was split between the museum dedicated to the clandestine immigration and the Israeli Navy, including a memorial to the crew who perished in the 1967 War, on the Eilat; a blood drive by the Magen David Adom; and the beach. It would have been difficult to avoid the beautiful and welcoming Mediterranean Sea.

I was very pleased to become one of nearly 5,000 people that have donated blood to MDA in Israel with the help or under the banner of AFMDA. It was an easy way to help save three lives in Israel through the MDA, as I regularly do in the United States through the American Red Cross. I would certainly encourage others visiting Israel to take the time out of their travel schedule and make a meaningful donation of blood to Israel.

After cleaning up from the beach, I was taken by friends to their favorite Arab restaurant, in the hills outside of Haifa. This restaurant was the scene of a homicide bomber from Hamas on March 31, 2002, killing 16 people and injuring over 40. This bombing took place during the Pesach vacation and the restaurant was crowded with families at the time. The food was so plentiful and so delicious I did not want to leave. We went from the restaurant to the friends' home overlooking Haifa, in a newer development, where we spent the evening talking and having a little dessert.

The next stop for me was Tzfat, the home of Kabbalah. I stayed at Ascent of Safed, where people stay to study, teach, learn about Kabbalah. It was a wonderful base of operations to explore the religious roots of Tzfat and the many artist galleries in the area, as well as other cultural venues, including a museum dedicated to the history of Hungarian Jewry, of which I am a half descendent. I also attended a bon fire in the Bal Shem Tov Forest, along with a rabbi from Los Angeles and a number of others staying at Ascent.

On the way back to Tel Aviv, I stopped in Herzliyah to find a former elementary school teacher from Agnon. I spent much of the day on the beach, waiting until her meetings were completed and then after work, she met me and we spent the evening reminiscing about people we remembered from our days at The Agnon School. We spent hours together remembering and laughing together, and also bringing each other up-to-date on what we have done in the nearly 40 years that have passed. It was a very special evening meeting with a very special person who was surely one of my "roots" to my love for Israel.

After a nice evening catching up with an old friend, I was dropped off at Ben Gurion Airport for the closure of the circle I created for four weeks in Israel. Each time I have been to Israel it has been difficult to return to the United States.

Anyone who has not spent time in Israel cannot understand that. I have now spent a total of 16 weeks in Israel and feel at home in Israel, a place that is home to all of us. If you have not traveled to Israel, I encourage you to do so and as soon as possible! Whether you travel on your own, on an organized vacation, a mission sponsored

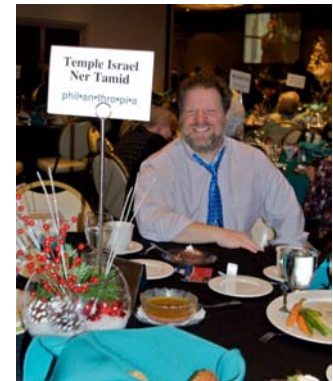
Philantropia

by one of the Jewish organizations, or with Sar-el, go! See Israel. Be a witness and spokesperson about the way that Israel is when the news is not on your television. The media paints a picture of Israel that is rarely positive. Those who have never experienced Israel can only believe what they see and read in the news or the newspapers.

The real Israel is not propaganda. The real Israel is a beautiful place with significance to the three main religions, Judaism, Christianity, and Islam. The tensions of Israel are exaggerated by the media and much of it is very isolated to a very small area on the Gaza Strip. Most Israeli Arab are not throwing stones. They are working, studying, living among the Jewish Israelis, and living their own lives in peace. Most Israelis are not fearing for their lives, they are also working, studying, living among the Arabs, and living their own lives in peace. This is not selling media coverage because it is not controversial.

It is so important that people understand what Israel is and what Israel is not, but you cannot understand it from your family room couch, or from Shabbat Services. You must go to Israel. Bring your family. Bring your interest and curiosity to a place with as many questions as answers. Be open to learn. You will be surprised when you find some of your preconceptions have been wrong. You will enjoy learning certain things, and frustrated learning other things. Either way, you will learn, and you will increase your love of Israel and Am Yisrael.

For Tu B'shvat: Decorate the Trees Outside and Feed the Birds

Simple bird feeders can be made to decorate the trees outdoors and give the birds and other critters their first spring treat. There are many ways to make simple bird feeders using basic supplies. Where string and other non-organic materials are used, be sure to remove them when the treats are gone.

- Tie one end of a string to the end of a pine cone. Cover the pine cone with peanut butter and roll in bird seed. Tie the other end of the string to a tree.
- Hang uncooked corncobs pieces in the tree along with plain rice cakes and bread.
- Apples, grapes, pomegranate halves, pears, and other fruits with a stem make great spring critter treats. For the non-tree climbing critters, sprinkle raw nuts and seeds at the base of the tree.
