Led by Social Action Committee Chair Peter Freimark, plus Becki Gisser and others, the St. Al's crew first cooked up a hearty pasta dinner with meat sauce right in the TINT kitchen. With the addition of green beans, salad, bread and dessert, the gang then transported the entire feast down to the church in Glenville to feed dozens of hungry adults and children. "By doing the cooking ourselves, we saved several hundred dollars," said Peter, enabling the Social Action committee to stretch its dollars to continue this important community service.

Admission will be by ticket, with the exception of children's, Yizkor and Ne'ilah services at the close of Yom Kippur. College students and military personnel with I.D. do not require tickets.

Each family will receive their tickets in August, provided that your dues are paid in full for the 2008/2009 fiscal year and **25%** of your dues are paid for 2009/2010 fiscal year. Additional tickets may be requested, for members of your family at \$80.00 each. If you need tickets for non-family members or you know of people who would like to attend our warm and welcoming High Holy Day Services, call our temple office to request additional tickets at \$180.00 each. We will need names and contact information for each ticket purchased. All worshippers will be asked to show their tickets at the main entrance. Tickets are *not* transferable.

For a donation of \$150.00 or more, High Holy Day Bimah flowers can be placed in memory of or in honor of loved ones. Your donation will be acknowledged throughout the High Holy Days.

### **Be 13 again (without the acne). Become an adult Bar or Bat Mitzvah!**

Were you never a Bat Mitzvah because no such thing existed when you grew up? Were you never a Bar Mitzvah because your congregation had only Confirmation? Have you chosen Judaism as an adult and never participated in your own Bar or Bat Mitzvah? Are you ready to be called to the Torah?

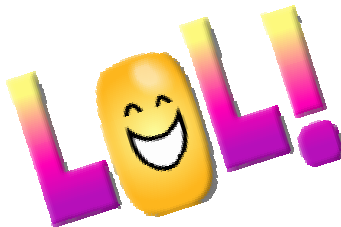
