New Lectern a Handcrafted Gift from the Heart

Master woodcrafter Richard (Dick) Schamberger presented Temple Israel Ner Tamid a one-of-a-kind gift that will become a legacy to future generations.

The lectern, now installed on the bima, will be dedicated at the Shabbat service on Friday, March 19th. Fittingly, that is also the night Dick's wife, Ann, will become an adult bat mitzvah.

Dick said, "The design of the lectern for Temple was done over a period of about eight months of sketching different ideas. A full scale drawing and a half scale mock up were made up and shown to Rabbi Matt before construction was started. Actual construction and finishing took about 300 hours."

The lectern is made of cherry with the inlaid panel being a book matched walnut burl. The ribbon effect border, as well as the Star of David are fiddle back sycamore and several other species inlaid into the burl.

Rabbi's Message



We had a fantastic Purim celebration on Sunday, February 28. The Sanctuary and Stark Family Social Hall were filled to overflowing with children, adults, carnival games, hamantaschen, laughter, music and yiddishkeit. It had been snowing all week; we had more than 18" on the ground. The snow blanketed the landscape, while we wrapped ourselves up in the warmth of a vibrant community. Next up...the arrival of spring, Pesach, longer days and more sunshine...thank God!

Among human traits, it is most important to cultivate an attitude of gratitude. Put in the reverse, Judaism teaches us, never to practice ingratitude. This is especially apt as we approach our joyous spring festival of Passover.

If there was a nation that ancient Israel was entitled to despise, it was Egypt, right? Over centuries, the Egyptians had enslaved our ancestors, and the Pharaoh had attempted to murder all newborn baby boys (Exodus 1: 22). Yet later, after the Egyptians had been punished with the Ten Plagues and the Israelite slaves had been freed, the Torah taught: "You shall not abhor an Egyptian, for you were a stranger in their land." (Deuteronomy 23: 8)

Why would the Torah have a special concern with NOT hating the Egyptians? Rabbi Joseph Hertz, the late Chief Rabbi of the British Empire commented (Hertz Chumash page 847), the Israelites were commanded to remember that originally they were allowed to enter Egypt as guests during a period of severe famine in Canaan. Although the Egyptians later turned on them, this initial act of kindness should never be forgotten.

And how should we live this in daily life? If you have in any way profited from another person with whom your relationship later soured, you must not allow yourself to forget that earlier good the person did for you.

In the words of Rabbi Joseph Telushkin, "the prohibition against ingratitude applies not just to personal kindnesses and favors, but also to intellectual influences." Thus you should be grateful to any person from whom you have learned. If you learned the basics from a person and now you have more knowledge than she, do not forget that without his/her initial teachings, you may not be where you are!

In the coming days, please take a few moments and express your gratitude to another person. And banish the words of ingratitude which you might otherwise speak. Your relationships with others will be better, and it will be fitting preparation for Pesach, our spring festival when hope springs eternal.

Pat joins me in sending good wishes and blessings for Pesach. Please, join us for the Congregational Seder, which will be on the second night of Pesach -- Tuesday, March 30, 2010 in the Stark Family Social Hall.

"Thanks, boss." says Abe, "I knew I could count on you!"

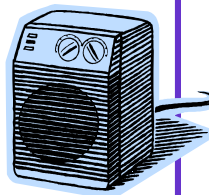

From the Board President's Desk: ***Jewish Philanthropy***

Jewish Philanthropy - Sometimes We're the Recipient, Other Times the Benefactor

Temple Israel Ner Tamid like many other Jewish institutions in Cleveland at times benefits from the general community contributions of larger infrastructure organizations. For example, TINT has received contributions from Jewish Education Center of Cleveland (JECC), which has provided TINT with funding for intergenerational Hebrew studies. But in turn, our temple is asked to contribute financially to community awareness and education programs. I would like to highlight three of these monetary contributions the temple makes each year and the excellent programming that you as congregants help us provide to the greater Jewish community .

Yom Hashoa - Cleveland's Commemoration of the Holocaust & Heroism

This event is free and open to the community, and honors Holocaust survivors and the 65th Anniversary of Liberation. This year, Yom Hashoah will be presented **Sunday, April 11, 2010 at 2 p.m.** At The Temple-Tifereth Israel, University Circle at Silver Park, 1855 Ansel Road, Cleveland

Yom Hazikaron and Yom Ha'atzmaut - The annual celebration of Israel's independence

The events are co-hosted by the Jewish Community Federation and B'nai Jeshurun Congregation. The events run consecutively on **Monday, April 19 , 2010 from 6 - 9 p.m.** B'nai Jeshurun Congregation, 27501 Fairmount Boulevard, Pepper Pike

- **Yom Hazikaron, 6-6:35 p.m.**
"Day of Remembrance" memorial service for those who lost their lives establishing, protecting and preserving the State of Israel, as well as those who died in terrorist attacks.
- **Yom Ha'atzmaut, 6:35-9 p.m.**
"Independence Day" celebration featuring entertainment for all ages: music, dance, a *shuk* (market) Israeli food court and more.

Chodesh Limud (Month of Learning)

Over the past several years we have supported Chodesh Limud (Month of Learning) at the Siegal College with a financial contribution from TINT. In addition, Rabbi Matt taught for Chodesh Limud a few years ago. Siegal College is Cleveland's higher education resource for classical Jewish learning and modern scholarship. This year, Chodesh Limud began on Sunday, January 17, and ran through Sunday, February 14. The month-long theme was "Navigating Today's Challenges: Inspiration from Jewish Wisdom."

These are all examples Jewish community events which get Temple Israel Ner Tamid's name "out there" for people to see, in addition to demonstrating our financial contribution to the Jewish community at large.

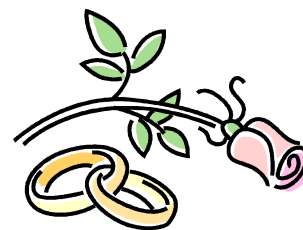

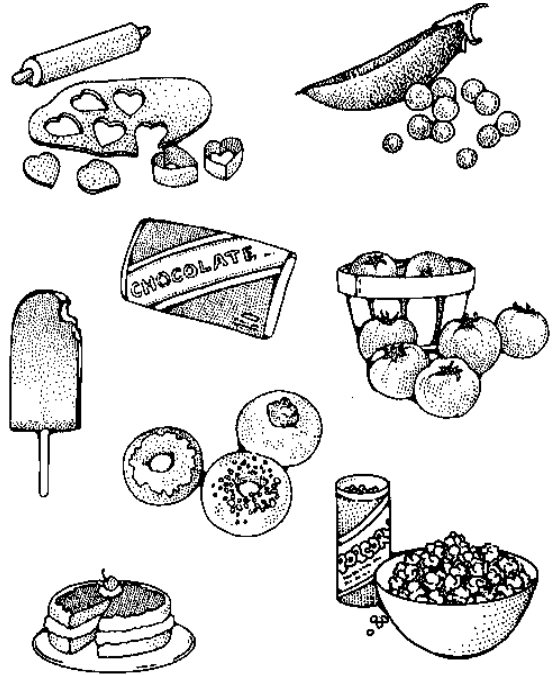

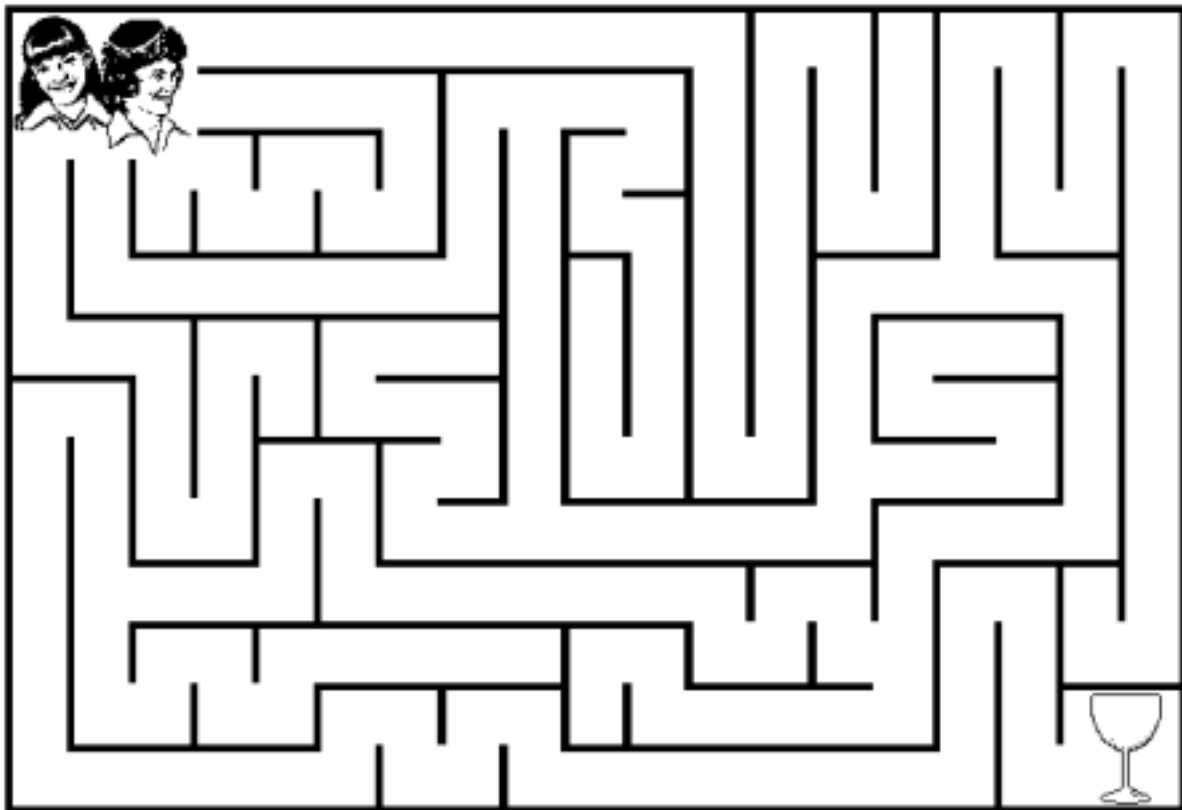
