Rabbi's Message



Please allow me more than the customary 500 words. I look forward to hearing your thoughts in person.

W is a very important letter. W sounds like “double you.” Let me ask you, do you know the FIVE Ws? Was your first thought: who, what, when, where, and why? That is a good guess, however, these FIVE Ws are a little different.

Let's begin at the beginning. I learned the THREE Ws from Sam Karff, my first colleague. In 1991, Rabbi Karff and Congregation Beth Israel, in Houston, gave me my first job as a rabbi.

Sam often said, “When you have your own congregation and look for people to serve on your board of trustees, look for those who will WORK...have some WISDOM...and some WEALTH. The person with all three is rare, two out of three is very good, but make sure you get one!”

In the summer of 1996, when I succeeded my father, Rabbi Fred, I added a fourth W...WORSHIP. During many years of committee and board deliberations, Nadine Bendycki and I realized our efforts bore the best fruit with a fifth W... WIT.

These FIVE Ws, on the board level, are critical to the efficient and effective operation of our congregation. But you know what? As a members of this congregation, the FIVE Ws are even more important. We need you!

Please, do not be afraid...the next phone call you receive from TINT will not force you to commit to be the perfect FIVE W. However, if you are within the hearing of your own voice, yes...the hearing of your own voice... then I ask you to “double you.” In other words, do more with TINT. When you attend you will be welcomed and asked to participate. You will not be conscripted.

Much of what follows (and much more) is either in THIS IsraelLight bulletin, or in the weekly Shabbat e-Announcements, or on our website. By the way, please make certain we have an email address for you, whether you are a member or not.

Several FIVE W suggestions for your consideration:

1. Work: After Religious School, April 19, about 50 adults and children did a yard clean-up, ate pizza, socialized, and fulfilled the old adage “charity starts at home.” Several members of the congregation sponsored the event as “dogooders” and paid for the pizza. On Tuesday, April 28, we did our monthly tzedakah at the St. Aloysius Hunger Center in Glenville. Sunday, May 17, will be the last day of Religious School and a Congregational Picnic. Are these things work? Yes, enjoyable work! By the way, if W #3 is a concern, you can make very significant contributions with the “work” W. I make monthly phone calls for anniversaries, and could use a few volunteers to make the birthday calls.

2. Wisdom: Wisdom is not static; it is dynamic and results from Torah learning, life experience, prayer and contemplation. Do you have expertise in a field of study or hobby? You can share your wisdom through a single or multi-session Adult Education offering or in Religious School. The Adult Ed sessions are always very enjoyable. Please avail yourself of these growth opportunities. Rabbi Fred teaches on Sundays during the school year, I do Wednesday evenings' Marv Setnik and Joy Gray also teach classes.

4. Worship: So you say you're not religious? It reminds me of a story about Harry Golden. Golden published the *Carolina Israelite* in the 1940s. Harry's father was a vigorous and outspoken rationalist and agnostic, yet rarely missed a service. One day in his teen years, Harry mustered enough courage to ask his father about this discrepancy. "Why do you go to shul when you say you don't believe in God?" Harry's father explained, "There are many reasons why a person would go to shul. Take my friend Dudja Silverberg. Dudja goes to shul to talk to God. Me? I go to shul to talk to Dudja."


Indeed, the function of the shul/synagogue is tripartite. It is a Beyt Tefillah, a house of prayer; it is a Beyt Midrash, a house of study and learning; and it is a Beyt Knesset, a house of assembly and socializing.

Please attend and bring friends. You do not have to be religious about it, just remember Harry Golden's father. Your presence will be much appreciated, especially for Confirmation on Friday evening, May 29. Yizkor for the festival of Shavuot will be Friday morning, May 29 at 10:30 a.m. The Religious School Teacher Appreciation Service and Ice Cream Sundae Oneg will be on Friday, May 15.

Parents with children...your child is never TOO young to attend Shabbat Services. And as a matter of fact, your child is never TOO old, nor are you too old, to join us on Friday evenings. Please "double you" and enrich us with your presence. Summer is the BEST time to come to Shabbat Services — it's bright, it's sunny, and there's not much homework!

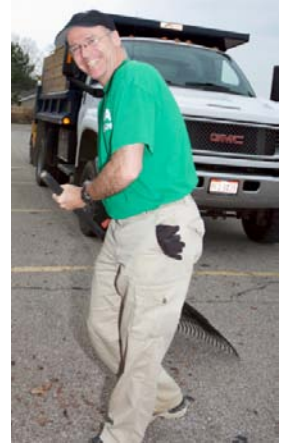
