TINT Speaker Series Returns on December 1st with **Mary Doria Russell**

Mark your calendars... tell your friends! **Mary Doria Russell**, a local resident and New York Times bestselling author, will be speaking at Temple Israel Ner Tamid at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, December 1, 2011.

For the second of our successful Speaker Series, Ms. Russell will discuss "Jewish Survival in Nazi-Occupied Italy," the basis of her book, *A Thread of Grace*, which was nominated for a Pulitzer Prize. The historical fiction tells the story of a group of Jewish refugees in Italy trying to escape Nazi persecution during World War II.

Ms. Russell, a convert to Judaism, is the author of several well-received novels, Her latest, *DOC*, the story of Doc Holliday, was published earlier this year to outstanding reviews.

Temple Israel Ner Tamid will donate a portion of the evening's proceeds to the American Joint Distribution Committee which, for almost a century, has been "rescuing Jewish lives at risk," including many Italian Jews after WW II. Additional proceeds will be used to further the Temple's many social action and religious education programs.

Tickets for the lecture are \$25 each and may be ordered directly from the Temple (440-473-5120) or via Pay Pal on our website, www.tintcleveland.org/russell. \$100 tickets can be purchased entitling the holder to a pre-lecture "Meet and Greet" with Ms. Russell and a copy of her book.

Rabbi's Message



L'shanah tovah u'metukah, may it be an happy and sweet new year 5772 for each of us... for all of us.

I was asked to excerpt the Rosh Hashanah morning sermon for the IsraelLight. However, the "Recognize Israel As A Jewish State" sermon was uncooperative. I gave it a gallant effort, but there was no way to slice 2500 words to 500 words. I hope our website mavens

will work their magic and put the High Holy Day sermons on our website. Please take a look for them in the coming days. Xeroxed copies of the sermons are available in the pamphlet tower in the foyer.

Considering the intensity of our High Holy Days just past, how about something a little lighter? Three Paragraphs For A Fun—And Filling—Chanukah:

(1) We must eat foods cooked in oil to remind us of the "oil miracle." But did you know that the larger the jelly doughnut, the smaller the amount of jelly? No matter how often you vow not to eat too many jelly-donuts, or potato latkes..., you will still eat too many of them. No matter which side of the jelly doughnut you bite, jelly will squirt out... and onto your clothing. Ditto for the potato latkes, sour cream, and applesauce.

(2) You will need 44 candles for Chanukah, your box will have 43. No more than a dozen of your candles will be bold blue or deep red. The rest will be various shades of pastels, which look extremely weak. The first night, there will be a deep family discussion about which direction to light the candles, right to left or left to right. Then you will realize, it doesn't matter on the first night, because left to right, or right to left, it's the same direction.

(3) Chanukah is a joyous celebration of religious freedom best shared with others. Please join us Friday, December 23rd for our Chanukah Family Service. Magician Manny Sperling will provide magical miracles, as usual. See the flier in this Temple IsraelLight for details and tzedakah opportunities. We hope to see you there.

May God's blessings rest upon us, our fellow citizens and the entire Jewish people.

From the President's Desk

Driving to work last week with NPR on my radio, I realized they were in the middle of their twice a year on-air fund drive. As glad as I am when it is over and I can hear my favorite programs straight through without their interruptions asking for donations, I thought back to a few years ago when I changed my donation to them.

Each year when they came on the air I would be reminded to donate once again because NPR is important to my life, and I didn't want to be just a listener rather than a subscriber. Funded 85% by private donors, I realized NPR would cease to exist without my support, and I would feel diminished. Then two years ago, as I listened to them exhort viewers to become a "sustaining member," in other words put a monthly amount on my credit card and forget about it, I realized I could actually up my donation yet feel it less by doing this. A small amount each month would equal a larger annual donation.

And so it is with Temple Israel Ner Tamid. Because it is so very important to my life, and because we are supported solely through dues and donations, I decided to become part of the Mensch Program and added an additional donation to my dues. But to donate all at once would have been difficult; so I decided to divide the amount throughout the year and put it monthly on my credit card – a doable amount automatically taken out.

Not only does this allow me to add a little more support to the congregation and programs I love, but I do it relatively painlessly, and for the temple, those congregants who pay monthly guarantee an income stream throughout the year.

So think about becoming a "sustaining member" of TINT – a Mensch Member at any level: \$618 (\$51/month), 1800 (\$150/month), 3600 (\$300/month) -- or an additional monthly donation of your choice, which multiplied by 12 adds significantly to sustaining our congregation. Call Wendy Weinberg, and she can set up a monthly plan.

No, you won't get a mug for your desk or hand-crank clock as a thank you gift. Instead you'll get the continuation of the temple's social action programs, special holiday programs, religious school, rabbi's visits, and whatever makes this holy congregation special to you. And I promise.....I won't break into the middle of regularly scheduled Shabbat services.

Milk Carton Dreidel

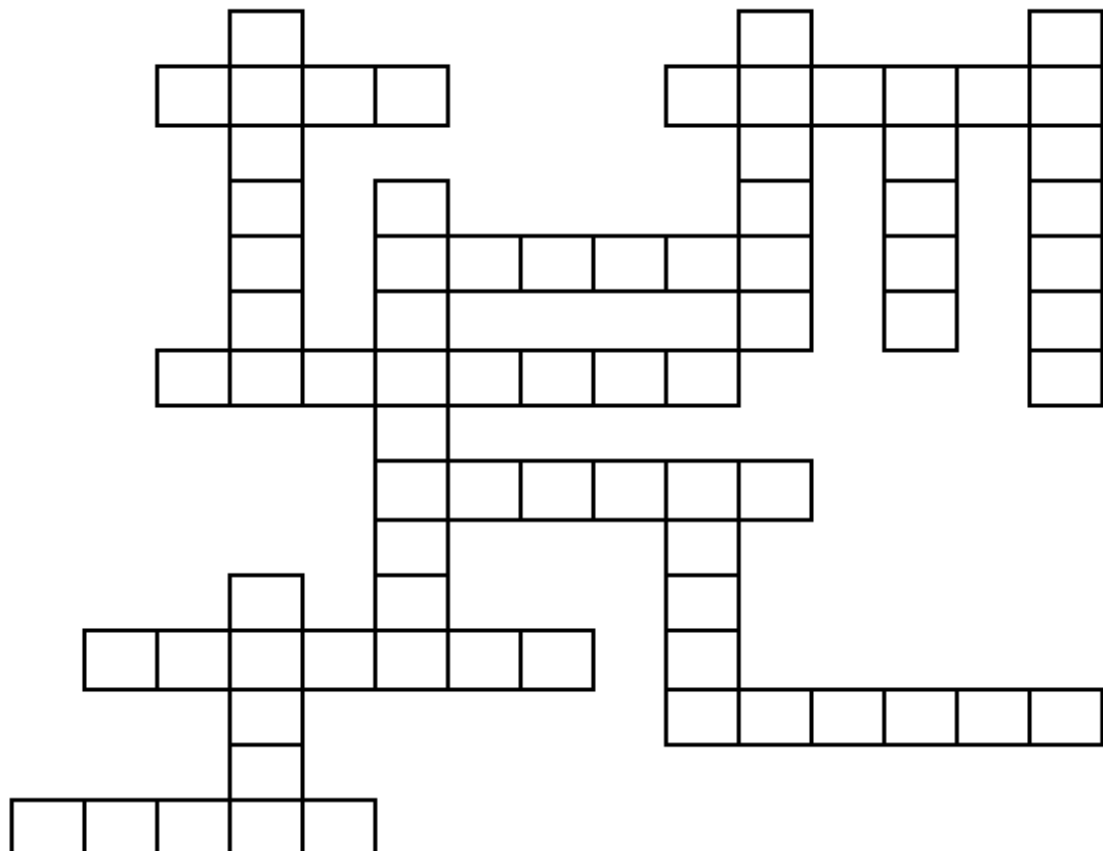


- 1 small, single size paper milk carton
- Masking tape
- Kitchen knife
- Acrylic paint
- 1 Popsicle stick
- Glitter pen or white craft glue and loose glitter

1. Take a small, empty milk carton container and wash it out thoroughly. Dry it gently using a kitchen towel.
2. Close the spout on the container and tape it shut using a small piece of masking tape.
3. Using a kitchen knife (parents, please do this part for your children) cut a small incision into the bottom center of your container, just long enough to put a Popsicle stick through.
4. Paint the entire milk carton whatever color you choose. If the paint looks streaky, do another coat. Wait an hour to make sure the paint is completely dry and then add the letters Nun, Hay, Gimel and Shin with glitter pens or craft glue and loose glitter to the four sides of your dreidel, one letter on each side.
